Driving Fundamentals Training

- **Simulation Lab**

(We begin with a single lesson to determine student's acclimation to simulator and skill level (if any). We may recommend the typical 8 hours instruction scheduled in four 2-hour lessons (typically 1:1) before beginning on-road instruction)

This course is designed to instruct students in the fundamentals of driving, including understanding and the application of the rules of the road, developing good driving habits and competency in the following core objective:

- Shuffle steering
- Pedal control
- Lane management
- Scanning
- Navigating intersections
- Observation, planning, judgment and decision making



Coaching Class – (Mandatory if student is testing with DrivingMBA)

- *(1.5 hours – ideally scheduled early on in the program)* This is the second half of the parent class and is appropriate for anyone that will be practicing with the novice adult driver. The class provides tips and techniques from a DrivingMBA instructor who introduces what to do when practicing with the student.

On-Road Driving Instruction

- **On-Road Driving Lessons**

(1:1 instruction scheduled in 2-hour lessons – packages available with 6, 8 or 10 hours of instruction)

Private instruction designed to continue to build fundamental skills around core objectives listed above. Student is exposed to a multitude of driving situations such as city and freeway driving and more. During the last 2-hour lesson the student has a brief warm-up and is evaluated. *If a student is registered for a program including 10 hours of on-road instruction, the student is evaluated. If the student passes DrivingMBA's evaluation, they are issued a waiver that will waive the test at the MVD.*



Defensive Driving Lab (Can be added)

(6 hours – 1:1 instruction scheduled in three 2-hour lessons. Scheduled after student is comfortable with basic skills, driving on the freeway, and driving at night). The program is designed to develop skills in hazard recognition, vehicle handling, space and speed management and further develop observation, planning and decision making skills. This is done through 40 different scenarios allowing students to experience a multitude of risky situations and the ability to learn from their mistakes. Students are assessed before they begin the program utilizing a profiler assessment to determine areas of weakness and again at the end of the program to measure improvement.
